
CEO MESSAGE

tum months. We also instated Annual Wellness Visits for Medicare patients to create Personalized Prevention Plans with their health care team.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH



The seventh annual "Let's Get Squished" 5K Breast Cancer Awareness Walk/Run had our largest crowd to date with 76 adults in attendance (plus many children) and raised our largest amount at \$6,280. The funds have already provided seven luxury comfort baskets to patients diagnosed with breast cancer at GMC.

GMC hosted one blood drive in July in conjunction with Vitalant. Beau Kroll, Lab Technician successfully facilitated both drives in the community and collected 40 bags of blood.

GMC offered Annual Blood Panels at reduced cost to patients with flexible, walk-in appointments twice for the year of 2023. Instead of coming in on the birthday month, patients are able to come in anytime during the calendar year and have their blood drawn. Patients can then take advantage of reduced prices again at the GMC Health Fair in the Fall.

GMC offered Sports Physicals at a reduced cost of \$25 in July and August for students who would be participating in athletics during the school year. The Sports Physicals included a full wellness check and vaccinations were offered as well during this time.

GMC held a Fall Health Fair September 21-26 in Carney Center. A large selection of panels was offered at a reduced cost. The event is continuing to slowly grow after a rebound from Covid-19.

GMC hosted walk-in flu clinics for patients of Gabert Clinic over several days in October as well as one Covid-19 vaccination clinic in November.

Due to rising costs of groceries, Glendive Medical Center held a food drive that gathered 332 lbs. of food for Dawson County Food Bank, 100 lbs. more than the 2022 food drive.

The Annual Tree of Lights Memorial Program for families grieving the loss of loved ones was held in-person for the first time since 2020. GMC Foundation raised \$3,516 this year for renovations of two hospice rooms for our hospice patients and families in 2024. Funds will also be used to purchase an Inogen Portable oxygen tank. This is an increase of \$1,461 from last year. We had 79 angels and 40 candles purchased.

The GMC Foundation hosted the 3rd annual "Adopt-A-Senior" program to raise funds for Christmas gifts for residents at GMC long-term care facilities. The goal was exceeded within one day and comfortable, warm, non-slip slippers were given to all residents in Extended Care and The Heritage.

GMC was awarded designation as a Community Trauma Hospital by the Montana Department of Health and Human Services in May 2023. A Community Trauma

> Hospital, also known as a Level IV trauma hospital, can provide Advanced Trauma Life Support to trauma patients upon arrival at GMC. GMC received an unprecedented three-year designation with no deficiencies whereas typically, healthcare facilities only receive a one-year designation on their first review.

GMC joined the American Heart Association's new initiative, "Rural Health Care Outcomes Accelerator" that provides no-cost access to "Get With

The Guidelines" quality programs and access to clinical experts, consultants, and other resources. Providing evidence-based care is proven to decrease morbidity and mortality by ensuring patients receive appropriate and timely treatment. GMC has made the commitment to address challenges through this initiative.

The "Nesting Place" class was implemented in 2023 for parents of newborns to provide a safe place to discuss the emotional and mental challenges in the postpartum months. The class is free for all new parents and is led by GMC Labor & Delivery nurses and was well-received by patrons.

A Nurse Residency program was designed to support graduate nurses, new to the profession. Experienced nurses are paired with the new nurses to help them as they transition into their first nursing position. The first cohort was well attended with six nurses and students.

Dr. Greene, Podiatrist and Falecia Rader, FNP for Orthopedics are providing outreach clinics to Miles City and Baker, respectively. Dr. Dinnan is also beginning an outreach practice in Miles City. These outreach practices allow patients greater access to specialized medicine as well as provide referrals to GMC Surgery.

GROWTH CONTINUED

The Reminder Call System was upgraded for patients who received services in Gabert Clinic or an outpatient setting within the last year. A new feature is the ability for patients to "text back" on the platform.

Seven Miles City Community College Nursing students participated in clinical rotations at GMC in spring of 2023. They had hands-on patient care experience that included Home Health, Respiratory Therapy, Extended Care, Transitional Care, and Gabert Clinic. The students expressed extreme gratitude of their learning opportunities and invaluable experiences and knowledge they gained during their time at GMC.

Annual Wellness Visits were scheduled for all Medicare patients to have an in-depth discussion about health history and concerns. The visits are free for all Medicare patients and provide an opportunity for early intervention of chronic illness and disease and to create a Personalized Prevention Plan with their health care team. We completed 144 visits in 2023.
